**GIFTS AND DONATIONS GROW THE ENDOWMENT FUNDS**

**■ VERA NOTMAN FOLLOWS IN HER BROTHER’S FOOTSTEPS**

During the past year the Glenboro Foundation took part in the Thomas Sill Foundation Challenge whereby if \$50,000 could be raised locally, \$25,000 would be forthcoming from Thomas Sill. There was a time element involved, it was to be completed by September 15<sup>th</sup>, 2016. Verna Notman, a lifelong resident of the area, stepped up and made a generous donation that along with others received for the challenge put the Glenboro Foundation’s contribution to this challenge “way over the top”! In distributing several sizable donations to Glenboro groups, Verna was following in her brother George’s footsteps in leaving a very large legacy to their home community. Verna said she liked to see the smiles on recipients’ faces when learning of the donations. Sadly, Verna passed away later in the year.



**■ DONORS’ CHOICE CONTINUES TO SUPPORT THE FOUNDATION**

The annual Donor’s Choice campaign in Glenboro, held in April, continues to support The Glenboro Foundation as it is one of nine charities listed for donations. In 2015 over \$8,800 was received with some designated and the balance being added to The Community Fund.

**■ 24 HOUR CHALLENGE**

The 24 Hour Challenge is a program of the Winnipeg Foundation held in November. For every \$5 raised by rural foundations during the assigned 24 hour period the foundation receives a stretch dollar from the Winnipeg Foundation, up to a maximum of \$2,000. Glenboro was successful again this year in building more funds in this manner for The Smart and Caring Community Fund, and received the maximum.

**■ TWO NEW DESIGNATED FUNDS**

**Raystone Centre Operating Fund**

During the past year an operating fund for Raystone Senior Centre in Glenboro was opened as an endowment fund. The annual investment income from this fund is designated to assist the Board at the Senior Centre with day to day operations of their building on Broadway Street. The first grant from this fund will be given in 2017.

**Glenboro Foundation Operating Fund**

Since the inception of The Glenboro Foundation in the late 80,s funds for its operation have come from donations, sponsorships and from fund raising events. Following the successful Thomas Sill Challenge in 2015 for which Glenboro received \$25,000, this sum was invested as a designated endowment fund to assist in the operating costs. The cost of items such as printing, stationery, postage, computer programs, audit, and the like, will now receive support from the annual investment income. The first grant from this fund will be given in 2017. Donations to these funds are acceptable and eligible for a charitable receipt.
